

Campership Policy

Process

- 1. The Scout's family provides the Committee Chair with the following basic family information:
 - o Total annual or monthly income
 - Number of family members (wage earners plus their dependents)
- 2. Pack 54 determines the family's position in terms of % FPL (Federal Poverty Level). For FPL, we use the "HHS Poverty Guidelines", updating our table each year as soon as we become aware of the notice published in the Federal Register. For 2019, this is as follows:

3. Pack 54 provides a campership at the following rates:

Up to 100% of FPL - 75% campership

Up to 150% of FPL - 50% campership

Up to 200% of FPL - 25% campership

Over 200% of FPL - no campership

- 4. The Pack will apply the campership rate to the following payments:
 - Dues
 - Event registrations
 - Summer camp (top off campership from camp/council to reach the stated campership level)

Notes

- Uniforms will be handled separately, e.g., provide experienced uniforms when available. A complete, new uniform and book costs about \$100. The Heart of New England Council provides a uniform purchase discount.
- The Pack Committee can consider exceptional circumstances with regard to the amount of campership to be provided for a specific event.
- If sufficient funds are not available to the Pack, the campership will be reduced or discontinued.
- Camping gear can be loaned to a participant on a per-trip basis. Camping gear is not given to participants.
