2010 Fall Family Camp Weekend October 8-10, 2010 Treasure Valley Scout Reservation



Important Notes:

- **Camping-** We will be using the sites in East Camp. Campsites will be assigned based on the number of participants registered (and paid in full) for each unit. Units not occupying at least 75% of the site capacity might need to share the site with another unit. Campsite Preference will be taken into consideration based on when the "Unit Reservation Form" AND at least one "Family Roster" (with payment) are turned in to the Council Service Center. Tents are not set up in each campsite- families will need to bring and assemble their own tents. Provided we don't have another frost, water will be turned on in each site.
- **Food-** All meals are included in the price for the event, meals include 2 crackerbarrels, 2 breakfasts, 2 lunches and 1 dinner for the whole weekend!
- **Leader's Meeting** A couple of leaders from each unit are invited to attend and receive information regarding weekend activities and updates to pass along to the rest of their group. Meeting will take place on Friday night after the movie starts in the Handicraft lodge.
- **Service Project-** For our Saturday Morning Activity, Projects will be available for all age and ability levels. If any adults attending with your unit are licensed in a skilled trade (electricity, plumbing, carpentry, etc.) and would like to help with a specialized project please contact Mike Vignaly at (508) 835-2664 or mike@vignaly.com.
- **Program Activities-** Saturday and Sunday activities will include archery, BB, 22's for 11 and older, rain-gutter regattas, boating, and crafts. Plus some special guests and programming to be announced that weekend. Plus build your own raft! Bring your bike and Helmet!
- **Fishing-** State Fishing licenses are required for all fishing participants ages 15+ (can be purchased at Wal*Mart or select sporting goods stores). Participants are encouraged but not mandated to bring their own fishing gear.
- **Campfire Program-** The Campfire Program will happen on Saturday night and ALL FAMILIES are encouraged to participate! Songs and skits will need to be previewed by event staff during the Saturday dinner break. Sign-up to perform at the Leader's Meeting on Friday night or just come and enjoy that good ol' Scouting Spirit!
- **Scout's Own-** On Saturday we will be hosting a Scout's Own (non-denominational worship service) and Catholic Services. Keeping in line with "A Scout is Reverent" we encourage all families to attend. Location TBA.



A Quick Note On...

Safety

This is a wilderness area characterized by certain inherent dangers. These dangers may include animals, insects, extremes in weather, rugged terrain and dehydration (**please drink lots of fluids**).
