**Camporee Check-In Procedures:**

Arrivals at the Camporee may begin any time after 4 PM on October 3rd. If you need to arrive early please contact us well in advance of the camporee so that we may make special arrangements for you. There will be a Senior Patrol Leader & Scoutmaster meeting and Cracker Barrel at 9:00 PM.

**One and only one vehicle will be allowed to drive down to the campsite. All Scouts must hike in with their gear that cannot be carried in the Troop vehicle.**

**Camporee Guidelines and Check-Out Procedures:**

1. We will be camping on the property of the Scamman Family as well as town Conservation Property. All Troop and general areas are to be kept clean, orderly and free from fire hazards.
2. All Troops should wear their Class "A" Uniforms to all flag ceremonies as well as the Scouts Own Service, and the Campfire. Class "B or C" Uniforms should be worn at all other times.
3. Each Scout and Scouter should carry a day pack with a water bottle, flashlight, whistle, and rain gear.
4. Water will be available on site but you may have to hike to get it. Please bring your water jugs filled when you arrive and refill as needed.
5. Every Scout, Scouter, and visitor will carry out the Scout Oath and Law in words, actions and behaviors.
6. All trash accumulated by each Troop is expected to be carried out and discarded at home.
7. Each Troop must have parental permission slips and medical information for every Scout in attendance. We will not collect these.
8. Each Troop and patrol should read over the scheduled competitions and be prepared with the materials needed to participate in the events.
9. All fires must be in "off the ground" fire pits.
10. Campsites will not be pre-assigned as there is plenty of room for everybody.
11. All Skits, Yells, and Songs must be in proper Scout behavior with material appropriate to the Scouting ideals.
12. All Guide to Safe Scouting policies will be followed and all Scouts must use the buddy system whenever they are away from their Troop campsite.
13. Check-out begins after the closing ceremonies. A camporee representative will inspect your campsite prior to awarding your Camporee patches and participation ribbons.

# General Rules and Information

## **Golden Skillet Competition – Best Camp-Made Chili**

- Adults may supervise, but should not physically assist with preparation and cooking.
- All preparation and cooking must be done at the Camporee
- You will be judged on:
  - Scout Spirit & Creativity
  - Cleanliness
  - Food Appearance (visually appealing, pleasing aroma, appropriate garnish)
  - Taste (not over/under done, ingredients and spices balanced for best flavor)
  - Overall Appeal & Presentation

## **Frisbee Golf**

- We'll have an 18 hole course set up. Regular Frisbees will be provided but feel free to bring your own as well.
- After the camp fire we will light the course up with glow sticks on the targets. If you wish to play bring your own glow in the dark Frisbee

## **2-Mile Corn Maze**

- The farm has a corn maze with up to 2 miles of trails. Bring a water bottle in case you get lost! Adult supervision is required.

## **Lumberjack Contest**

- There will be multiple parts to this event. You'll be chopping wood, dragging logs using the timber hitch, cutting wood with a bow saw, and more. Each troop should bring 40' of log dragging rope, an axe, and a bow saw. Please make sure the saws and axe have a proper safety sheath.

## **Obstacle Course**

- No materials are required. There will be a mix of obstacles and team building challenges!

## **1 Hour Conservation Project:**

- The land abutting the Scamman Farm is conservation land in the town of Stratham. Each Troop will participate in a 1 hour conservation project consisting of clearing logs and brush from paths in the woods. You should wear boots, long pants, and work gloves.

## **Rescue Mission**
