The Quinsigamond District Activities Committee proudly presents a combination Boy Scout Spring Camporee and a Cub Scout Chuckwagon Derby. The theme for the Camporee is Call of Duty with Night OPS Missions. The Camporee will run **NIGHTTIME** and daytime programs including Spy missions, Search missions, Decoding challenges, Glow in the dark activities and a few other Top Secret events. As part of the Call of Duty theme all Troops in attendance will be asked to assist with the operation of the Cub Scout Chuckwagon Derby on Saturday.

Registration

Every unit that will be attending MUST send an e-mail to KGL125@aol.com with the following information on or before April 14, 2017.

Troop number, number of Scouts attending, number of adults attending, 1st and 2nd choice for campsite reservation, anticipated arrival time, anticipated departure time, Chuckwagon Derby station idea if you have one. If not, one will be assigned to your unit. Remember the earlier you sign up the better the chance of getting your first choice of campsite (also it will help the event planners).

Cost

The cost to attend the Camporee is \$ 10.00 per Scout. This fee includes facility rental fees, patches, support and program material cost. There is no fee for adults attending. All registration fees (cash or check) will be collected at check in on Friday night.

Patches

All Scouts that participate in the Camporee and the Chuckwagon Derby will earn a patch for each event. Adults may purchase patches at \$ 2.00 per patch.

Camp site reservations

Units participating in the Camporee and Chuckwagon Derby will not be charge a campsite rental fee. All units will camp in one of the following sites. Chippewa, Evergreen, Hemlocks Hickory, High Mesa, Pine Acres, Madore, Sleepy Hollow, Tall Maples or Thunderbird. To request a site please send an e-mail to KGL125@aol.com with your 1st and 2nd choices of campsites. Sites will be assigned in the order of the e-mails received. If required, the Camporee Staff may assign more than one unit to each campsite.

Water

The water system at Treasure Valley may not be in operation for the weekend. Please plan accordingly by bringing your own supply of potable water. Water containers may be refilled at the outside faucet at the rear of the Magee Building.

Toilet Facilities

Due to the fact of the water system not being turned on for the weekend, the flush toilets in the campsites will not be operational. The Central Restroom, the Visitors Latrine, campsites with pit toilets and portable toilets will be available for the weekend.

Parking

Each Troop may park in the campsite they are assigned to. If extra space is needed please use the Jamboree Field. During the Chuckwagon Derby on Saturday vehicle travel in camp will be limited.

Equipment

Each patrol must come prepared with the following equipment to participate in the Call of Duty / Night Ops Camporee. Paper, writing utensils, compasses. Each participant should have a flashlight.

Meals

Each Troop is responsible for their meal planning, procurement, preparation and cleaning.

Trash

Each Troop should take any trash/garbage generated during the weekend home with them to be disposed of properly.

Staffing

Boy Scouting is a boy run program. It is asked that each unit in attendance provide us with the expertise of 2 of your Junior Leaders to assist with the running of the assigned missions. Obviously any adult help will be welcomed (and encouraged).

6:00-8:00 pm Arrive, check in at the white tent in the field above the Baden Powell site, set up camp
8:00 Patrols meet at field above Baden Powell site to receive their Top Secret Orders
8:15 -11:00pm Patrols complete their assigned **NIGHTTIME** missions
11:00 pm -7:00am Rest for the next adventures

Saturday, May 13

7:00 -8:00am Troops refuel in their sites
8:00am Patrols meet again as before to receive their daytime missions
8:15-11:00am Patrols compete in their daytime missions
11:00- 11:30 Troops refuel with a QUICK lunch
11:30am-5:30pm Patrols go undercover as Cowboys to assist with the Cub Scout Chuckwagon Derby
5:30-6:30pm Refuel again (it takes a lot of energy to round up those Cub Scouts)
6:30-8:30pm Meet as before for final nighttime mission
8:30-9:00pm Cracker-barrel to give you a chance to mingle with your fellow spies
